

Moments in History

April 14th, 2016. Daniels v. Canada, a historic Supreme Court ruling. The Supreme Court of Canada ruled that the Federal Government has Constitutional responsibility for Métis and non-Status Indians, marking a historic victory for Indigenous peoples in Canada and ending a 17-year legal battle.





MNC Policy Updates



Métis Nation British Columbia (MNBC) and the Fox Family have partnered in the creation of a permanent plaque display celebrating Terry Fox and the Fox Family's Métis heritage. Located in front of the iconic Terry Fox Statue at BC Place, the inscription recognizes the family's Métis identity. The plaque, designed in partnership with Canadian artist Douglas













Coupland, builds on the relationship that MNBC and the Fox Family have built over the last number of years, including the creation of a commemorative sash, and the design of the 2021 Terry Fox Run t-shirt. The shirt and its unique artistic design was a success not only in the Métis community, but around the country, and was one of the best-selling shirts in the run's history. The Fox Family, MNBC, Indigenous Sport, Physical Activity and Recreation Council (I-SPARC), the Coquitlam School District (SD43) and the BC Sports Hall of Fame all partnered on the creation of the Terry Fox: Inspiration in Action Lesson Plans for elementary schools. Through the Inspiration in Action Lesson Plans, students will explore Terry's life story through a new lens, examining his family's discovery of their Métis ancestry – while further exploring what it means to be Métis.

KOKUM'S KITCHEN RECIPES

One of my go to recipes for potlucks, feasts, holidays, particularly in summer is "Sweet Rice" the recipe is as follows:

Always wash your rice before cooking. Washing rice is easy, let it soak in cold water for a few hours or even overnight, then strain on a mesh sieve. Cook your rice by boiling in water until tender (about 45 mins, but this can vary) Wild rice should be boiled in water with a 3:1 ratio, water to rice.

While your rice is cooking, wash berries of your choice – I like blueberries and strawberries, but have used raspberries, grapes, apples, pears, raisins, currants etc.

Slice the strawberries or other fruit to the size of your choice, I prefer smaller pieces that go further.

When the rice is done cooking, you can cool it naturally by letting it rest, or rinsing with cold water in a sieve. When the rice is cooked, move to a serving bowl and mix in the berries. You can also add nuts, walnuts, pecans, cashews etc.

Now comes the not to secret ingredient in our "Sweet Rice" Maple sugar or syrup to taste. - I put a tablespoon or 2 of sugar, or a ¼ cup of syrup (this all varies based on the size of the dish, so go by taste and make it how you like it) Let stand for 20 minutes to let the sugar/syrup blend with the rice and serve cold with virtually anything you like. I love it as a side to grilled lake trout or whitefish.
